





Incidents by Type June 2023 Total: 287









Incident Responses by Station





Incident Responses By Station





2023 Firefighter Safety Stand Down

- Safety Stand Down is a joint initiative of the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) and the National Volunteer Fire Council (NVFC). The event is coordinated by the IAFC Safety, Health and Survival Section, the NVFC, the National Fire Protection Association, and the Fire Department Safety Officers Association, and is supported by national and international fire and emergency service organizations as well as health and safety-related organizations and agencies.
- Held during the third full week of June each year, the 2023 event will take place from June 18-24. Fire and EMS departments are encouraged to suspend all non-emergency activity during Safety Stand Down to focus on training and education related to this year's theme. An entire week is provided to ensure all shifts and duty crew can participate.
- Safety Stand Down is the unification of the IAFC's Fire/EMS Safety, Health, and Survival Week with the NVFC's National Firefighter Health Week. The goal of both organizations is to reduce the number of preventable injuries and deaths in the fire and emergency services. Safety Stand Down focuses on the critical importance of responders taking care of themselves both on and off the emergency incident scene. The week is designed to increase awareness and action so that safety and health become a priority in all fire and emergency service departments.
- The theme of Safety Stand Down 2023 focuses on responder safety during incidents involving lithium-ion batteries. Each day will focus on a different topic within this theme: recognition of hazards, firefighting operations, firefighter safety, post-incident considerations, and public education.



New Career Firefighters in the Department

• We welcome Firefighters Michael DeStefano, Pearce Flanagan, and Neil Hemmerle to the Upper Darby Township Fire Department. As with all our firefighters, they successfully completed their training in the Philadelphia Fire Academy and will now begin their six-month probationary training within the Upper Darby Township Fire Department. The in-house training is instructed by our Captains and mentoring senior firefighters. They will study and train on Department Policies and Standard Operating Guidelines, articles and handouts, station duties, radio operations, bleed control kits, multigas detectors, thermal imaging detectors, truck and engine company operations, driver operations, squad company operations, vehicle rescue, confined space rescue, water rescue, and much more.



Hands-On Electrical Fire/Arson Investigation

• For three days in June, our Acting Fire Marshal and our fire investigators attended a Hands-On Electrical Fire/Arson Investigation class taught by Steve Riggs from the Law Enforcement Risk Management Group, Inc. Our investigators joined other investigators and Fire Marshals from Federal and local municipalities and learned practical and technical skills necessary to investigate and determine the origin and cause of electrical and appliance fires.

U.D.T.J Pride Festival 2023





Smoke Alarm Installations


