
MARCH 2023 AVERAGE RESPONSE TIME







INCIDENT RESPONSES BY STATION







STATION CALL PERCENTAGES





INCIDENTS BY SHIFT










UPPER DARBY CAR 3 MARCH 2023 INCIDENTS BY THE HOUR OF THE DAY



MARCH 2023 CAR SEAT INSTALLATION

- Upper Darby Township Fire Department has certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians:
- In March, the Delaware County Traffic Safety Project teamed up with our CPS Techs and hosted a Delaware County Car Seat Check Event at the Cardington Stonehurst Fire House in Upper Darby. This event was free of charge to families who registered for the event. The appointments were one-on-one, in person with a certified car seat safety technician.
- Our CPS Techs also scheduled and installed two other child passenger safety seats in the month of March aside from the Car Seat Safety Check Event.

Career and Volunteer members of our department attended the I.A.F.F. Peer Support Training Program hosted by the Upper Darby Professional Firefighters Association and delivered by I.A.F.F. master peer support instructors. This two day in person training program gave members the necessary knowledge and skills to provide support to their peers and gave them a basic understanding of common behavioral health issues affecting the fire service. Peer Support Training can serve as a bridge to community resources or behavioral health treatment when indicated and build or enhance the peer support program.

The mission of the program is to offer confidential assistance and support to all members and families during times of personal need or due to traumatic incidents. Peer Support training does not replace professional treatment but is put in place to help minimize the traumatic effects that some incidents or occurrences can cause during a career.




Five (5) Volunteer members of the department successfully completed continuous education in emergency medical services in the field of seizure recognition and first aid. Con-ed training in emergency medical services fields are becoming crucial in our day-to-day activities with the increased medical responses that our department is experiencing.



One (1) Volunteer member of the department successfully completed their training as an instructor in basic life support through the American Heart Association. This allows the member to teach First Aid, CPR, AED, and bloodborne pathogens courses




Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) Team Training

Smoke Alarm Installations




