GUIDE TO REGULAR HOUSEHOLD TRASH COLLECTION SERVICE

Regular Household Trash consists of garbage, rubbish and trash waste material generated in private homes or apartment buildings with less than five units. The following items may also be acceptable for Regular Collection, if properly prepared for pick-up:

- <u>Mattresses/Box springs</u>: Put out with your regular trash, but limited to only one (1) each per collection. Mattresses/box springs cannot be rain soaked and MUST be placed in a sealable clear plastic or vinyl mattress bag. Mattress disposal bags are sold at most major retailers and home improvement stores, such as Home Depot, Lowe's, and Amazon.com.
- <u>Grass Clippings</u>: Place all grass clippings in a bag in the trash can, not loose in the can.
- <u>Carpeting</u>: Carpeting must be cut down to 3 feet in length, rolled up, and tied in a bundle. Each bundle should not exceed 40 lbs. and cannot be rain soaked.
- **Branches**: Branches must be cut down to 3 feet in length and tied in a bundle. Each bundle should not exceed 40 lbs. Branches should not be greater than 4 inches in diameter.
- Large Glass Items or Broken Glass: Any large glass items, such as glass table tops and mirrors, should be broken down and placed in a sealed box. To prevent serious injuries, please do not place any broken glass in trash bags.
- <u>Paint</u>: Latex Paint (water based): Remove the lid from can and the paint must be completely dried out. Use kitty litter or a "paint dry" product if needed. Oil-based paint is a hazardous waste and is not acceptable. Check the next page of this newsletter for the date and location for hazardous waste drop-off.
- <u>Couches & Small Furniture Items</u>: Small tables, chairs, couches, and televisions will be picked up with your regular trash but are limited to only one (1) furniture item per trash collection.
- Collection Time: Trash must be set out for pick-up no later than 7:00 A.M. on your scheduled trash day. Cans must be removed from the trash line no later than 6:00 P.M.
- <u>Trash Can Size</u>: Trash cans should not exceed 32 gallons in size and should not have permanently attached lids. Any cans larger than 32 gallons or cans with attached lids may not be completely emptied due to the can size or attached lids.
- Weight limit: The combined weight of a trash can and the trash shall not exceed 40lbs. This includes days when there is excessive amount of rain and the can fills with water. (It is helpful to punch drainage holes in the bottom of your trash can.) The allowable total combined weight per household pick-up is 200lbs.

Acceptable Recycling Items

- Newspaper and Paper
 - This also includes magazines, periodicals, catalogs, telephone directories, junk mail, and paperback books
- Cardboard
 - · All boxes should be flattened
- Aluminum, Steel, and Bimetal Food & Beverage Cans
 - All cans must be rinsed clean of any food or liquid waste
- Plastic Containers
 - We only accept plastic containers numbered 1, 2, 4, 5 or 7 in a triangle on the bottom of the containers
- Glass Containers
 - All bottles and jars must be rinsed clean of any food or liquid waste

Contaminated Recycling Items

- Any items placed inside plastic bags
- Plastic bags of any size
- Food waste and household trash, including pizza boxes
- Lids and caps from plastic or glass containers
- TVs and other electronic waste
- Styrofoam and other packing materials
- Shredded paper
- Wood and scrap metal
- Yard waste
- Garden hoses
- Ceramics
- PVC pipe
- Furniture



PLEASE NOTE: RECYCLING INSIDE PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.

EPA NPDES STORMWATER PROGRAM

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Stormwater Program is a federal mandate enacted by the 1987 Amendments to the Clean Water Act. Under this Program, Upper Darby Township is required to monitor, maintain, and prevent stormwater runoff from washing harmful pollutants into the nearby creeks.

You can make a difference! Please practice some of these good stewardship habits for a cleaner and healthier environment:

- Never dump anything down storm drains.
- Pick up after your pet and dispose of their waste properly; DO NOT throw their waste into storm drains.
- Sweep up the grass clippings after mowing your lawn.
- Do not blow or pile leaves into the streets that may eventually clog storm drains.
- Sweep up litter in front of storm inlets/drains.
- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly, avoiding excess to prevent polluted runoff.
- Check your car for leaks and recycle motor oil.
- Do not discharge chlorinated pool water directly down storm drains or into creek.
- Educate your relatives and neighbors on proper stormwater stewardship.

Holiday Trash & Recycling Schedule

WEEKLY YARD WASTE BEGINS MONDAY APRIL 10

Upper Darby Township will be collecting yard waste every week on your regular recycling day from Monday, April 10th.

Yard waste includes:

- Leaves
- Garden residues
- Shrubbery
- Tree trimmings (4 inches or less in diameter and less than 3 feet long)

NO plastic bags! Place yard waste in biodegradable paper bags or loose in trash



2022 Year In Review

In 2022, Mayor Keffer and her administration accomplished many steps toward her goal of reinvesting in, reforming, and revitalizing Upper Darby. We look forward to having many more in 2023!

- Installed solar panels and converted to solar energy at the municipal buildings and the Watkins Senior Center
- Finished construction of the Upper Darby One Center which will have its grand opening in January
- Allocated a total of roughly \$25.9 in ARPA funding for various initiatives including public safety and sewer infrastructure improvements, parks and open space acquisitions and local grant programs
- Completed site demolition and secured roughly \$9 million in a combination of state and federal grant funding for the first ever Upper Darby Community Center
- Welcomed two members to the K-9 unit of UDPD
- UDPD continued pursing state accreditation with an expected award date in 2023
- •Partnered with local private owners of Pilgrim Gardens Shopping Center to install solar parking kiosks.
- Fire Department's improvements to trainings and dedication through the pandemic resulted in an increased ISO rating which will help to lower community home insurance rates
- Launched new Trash Fee Rebate program for eligible senior residents or those with disabilities
- •Began construction on the new Darby Creek bridge which will connect Gillespie Park to the Swedish Cabin
- Brought goats to Gillespie Park in order to clear out invasive species and plant new trees along Darby Creek
- •Launched new and improved website with better functionality and online service options for our residents
- Hosted a wide variety of events including the International Festival, two Shred Events, a Mental Health & Wellness Fair along with multiple neighborhood meetings and town halls

Upper Darby Has A New Fence Permit!

In order to preserve the visual character of Upper Darby's residential neighborhoods and prevent the installation of nonconforming fences, Township Council passed Ordinance No. 3116. The new ordinance passed on June 15th 2022, updated the existing fencing regulations and created a new Fence Permit. The new permit is regulated by the Upper Darby Township Department of Licenses and Inspections. Any contractor or homeowner looking to replace an old fence or install a new fence must have an approved permit from the Department of Licenses and Inspections which can be found at www.upperdarby.org/formsandfee

IMPORTANT! 2023 TAX STRUCTURE UPDATES

As part of Mayor Keffer's initiatives to reinvest and modernize, the Upper Darby Tax Office is implementing a state of the art Real Estate Tax, Trash and Sewer Fee processing system. Our new system will support faster and more accurate payment processing, and you will see a new bill format with this year's mailing in early February 2023. There will now be separate, easily read coupons for Trash, Sewer and Real Estate Tax including scannable lines for automated processing. Please remember to return your coupons with your payment.

Bills will be mailed on February 1, 2023. To pay the discounted real estate tax amount, please pay your tax bill by March 31, 2023. The full, undiscounted amount is due by May 31, 2023. Sewer and Trash fees are due by May 31, 2023.
